January Hymn of the Month

"In His Temple Now Behold Him" # 314 Moravian Book of Worship

Monthly a hymn of the month is chosen so that we may become familiar with a new tune, the text and learn the origin of the hymn.

"In His Temple Now Behold Him" lyrics were written by Henry J. Pye, in 1851. Pye was presented to the rectory at Clifton-Campville, Staffordshire, but late in life became a catholic after he married a bishop's daughter. He wrote books of sermons and compiled a hymnal.

The tune, Westminster Abby, was composed by the renowned English composer, Henry Purcell, who lived from 1659-1695. The tune was originally written for the hymn, "Christ Is Made The Sure Foundation", but was very popular and was used for other hymns lyrics.

This hymn celebrates the Great Epiphany, as the Savior is first discovered by the Gentiles. It is a re-telling of the Magi and confirms that the ancient prophecies of the coming of a Messiah have been fulfilled.

It can be interpreted that His temple is wherever you find Christ; be it in a church or in a lowly manger. Wherever you are, and however He is presented to you, we should celebrate being in His presence.

Church Council Meeting High Lights

Nov. 21, 2018

New Board Members Elected: Fay Ayers, Steve Larsen, and Greg Simpson. Board reported it had appointed Jane Bumgarner to replace Rosanne Moses since she has moved.

Note: At a later Board meeting Margaret Schultz was appointed by the Board to replace Duane Hutto who had to resign because of family health issues.

The 2019 budget was presented by Mark Bumgarner that had been approved by the Church Board. It has increased by approximately \$5,000. Main reason was due to a substantial increase in provincial requests of approximately \$3,000. Adjustments were made on pastor's salary and an additional insurance policy has been

implemented for Staff and board for their protection. This was recommended by the Province. Any one that was unable to attend the meeting and would like a detailed budget contact Mark and he will provide one for you. It was also presented that our giving this year is approximately \$3,000 behind our actual expenses. We hope everyone will consider this in their 2019 giving.

There has also been a committee created to review and revise if needed the rules and regulations of New Hope. They will be presented to the Church Council sometime in 2019.

The board will be discussing growth and giving as their main focus at the Board retreat this coming year.
