I will begin by telling you I wasn't aware of what we do in the community as well as for our own congregation until I became chair for this group. What has been truly heartwarming is working closely with other church members who are eager to work with our committee and see the responsibilities they all seem so eager to take on. Getting to know these members on a much more personal basis has blessed my own life and makes our projects so much fun!

Witnessing the giving hearts of our members has also been quite a blessing. We have no lack of volunteers for our work with The Corner Table and Eastern Catawba County Christian Ministries (ECCCM). It is a responsibility of Service and Witness to gather volunteers and put together, serve, and clean up a meal at The Corner Table. We also organize our volunteer efforts to spend time at ECCCM to help them in any way needed.

The Corner Table is a ministry in downtown Newton that serves lunch each weekday to anyone that shows up and asks for it. We are proud of our reputation for preparing and serving one of the favorite meals they serve, our sloppy joes! We always get rave reviews and they won't let us consider anything else!

ECCCM is actually a group of churches joining efforts to serve the local community in need. We gather clothes and food for their distribution, so time spent volunteering there may be anything from sorting food to marking and/or applying labels to apparel. It is always a "warm fuzzy feeling" when leaving there after spending a few hours at work with other like-minded folks.

We also work with both men's and women's homeless shelters, school systems, and the county, as needs arise. There are still so many needs that we are not even aware of. We ask for your prayers God will lead us to situations with the greatest need, that we may do His will. We pray all in our congregation will have the opportunity to serve where called, for we know we all receive back so much more than we are ever able to give.

We are also responsible for areas of fellowship and family life within our own congregation in addition to areas of outreach. Such as; picnics, Easter Egg hunts, covered dish meals, receptions, and most every gathering outside of worship is handled by this quiet but very active committee. It has really been fun working with everyone involved to make all these events happen. Please support us with your prayers, or better yet, join us at our next meeting. If you cannot participate, we could use candy to hand out. (Individually wrapped, please)


