"Lord Grow Me Spiritually!"

Spiritual Maturity! Don't you wish you could just take a pill, or snap your fingers or quote Bible verses enough times to become spiritually mature? I mean, really! This journey of our spiritual growth is hard work; isn't it? Quite frankly, there are days when

the journey gets so heavy; we want to escape to a remote island. Spiritual maturity takes real work! Sometimes it hurts, sometimes it's inconvenient, sometimes it seems out of our reach, and sometimes it calls for a deep desire within us that we are not quite sure, we've got.

Yet, there is no easy way around it. Spiritual maturity is NOT automatic! It takes intentional commitment to grow. We must WANT to grow! We must DECIDE to grow. We must MAKE AN EFFORT to grow. And we must PERSIST to grow! We like a young child must learn to crawl before we walk and learn to walk before we can run; real life is just like that. Real spiritual maturity like the maturity of a young child begins with the inner motivation and decision to be persistent every day, no matter what our mental and physical feelings tell us. Clearly, even our daily scheduled commitments can motivate us spiritually or destroy us, but nevertheless, they will define us. So, I ask you today, what are you wholly committed to in your life? What is it that remains front and center in your life regardless of the shifting tides and turbulent winds of your life? Is it Christ Jesus or the ways of the world? Is your life defined by your faith or by your lack of faith?

In John 11, Mary and Martha's hearts were broken at the loss of their brother, and yet, they were STILL committed to Christ. They STILL believed He could do the impossible. They STILL honored Him even though they couldn't begin to understand the logic of Jesus' decision to tarry when Lazarus needed Him the most. STILL, in time, their commitment to STILL follow Christ revealed the underlying rationale in their experience.

What do you think...Do we as followers of Christ fail to be completely committed to STILL growing spiritually; or do we bail-out too soon? Do we give up trying to grow in our faith; we're just happy with a little of Jesus. Anymore and it might seem like, we are being a Jesus fanatic or a little to "churchie" for those around us. Friends, when we bail-out, we are giving up on the true abundance of Christ and the reality of enjoying the benefits of true spiritual maturity. When we bail-out, we never really experience and taste the joy available for those who STILL remain faithful EVEN when they don't understand what God is doing in their situation. In these times of being STILL, we must remind ourselves that in the dark hours of our lives, in the discouraging times that absolutely nothing is hidden from God. He knows our

deepest feelings, our desires, our excuses, and our heartfelt needs; God knows us. He knows everything about us. He REALLY knows US! He knows us individually and personally, He knows us far better than we know ourselves. And yet, He STILL loves US and draws US to Himself! So, why fret? Why struggle? Why bail-out? Why seek another route? When you think about it, there isn't another route or way...Not really. For, all of our life, the real freedom of our life and our joy is found only in Christ Jesus and no other. Without Christ, in our life; our life is a miserable and meaningless existence. Without Jesus there is no HOPE.

Why don't you tell Jesus how you feel today; He already knows. Ask Him to grow you spiritually? Tell Him, how much you need Him in your life...Tell Him you cannot live another day without Him! Then, fully commit yourself to Him, wholly and completely, no matter what interruptions, or trials or stormy clouds are pressing in, on you...No matter how hard the rain begins to fall on your situation. Say, Lord Jesus, I am STILL Yours forevermore...Lord, GROW ME spiritually; Lord, I want to be more like Christ Jesus!


