Investing the Talents God Gives You

"I was afraid and went out and hid your talent in the ground."
(Matthew 25:25 NIV)

Oswald Chambers said, "God who made the birds never made bird cages. It's men who make bird cages [and put people in them] and after a while we become cramped and can do nothing but chirp and stand on one leg."

In one of Jesus parables, He illustrated how everybody is responsible for making good use of the talents he or she has been given. The one who had been given ten talents invested in them wisely and was rewarded accordingly. The man who had only one talent (hid his talent in the ground); thus, he lost it.

This principle is uniquely true in many areas of life: For example, as in this story, "Apples of Gold" ... A few years ago, a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table which held a display of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly missed boarding.

All but one! He paused, took a deep breath, got in touch with his heartfelt feelings and experienced a twinge of great concern and compassion for the girl whose apple stand had just been overturned. He told his buddies to go on without him, waved good-bye, told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his reason for taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the terminal floor.

He was glad he did return ... The 16-year-old girl was totally blind! She was tenderly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly

groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her; no one stopping to help her, and no one trying to assist her in her time of difficulty.

The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them back on the table and helped organize her display. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become very badly battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket.

When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the blind girl, "Here, please take this \$40 for the damage we did. Are you okay?" She nodded through her tears. He continued with the words, "Forgive us, I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister...." He paused and turned to look back into her blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?"

He stopped in mid-stride and wondered ... As he quickly went back and said, "No, I am nothing like Jesus—He is good, kind, caring, loving, and would never have bumped into your display in the first place."

"The girl gently nodded: "I only asked because I prayed for Jesus to help me gather the apples. He sent you to help me, so you are like Him—because only God knows who will do His will. Thank you for hearing His call, Mister."

Then the salesman quickly and safely made his way to catch the later flight with the blind girl's burning question bouncing about in his heart and mind: "Are you Jesus?" (Story "Apples of Gold" from Acts-Daily Encounter)

Do your words and actions reflect Jesus? Do people mistake you for Jesus? Do you use the talents God has given you? Helping others and showing compassion can be talents given to us for the good of helping and serving others. When we use our talents, we please God. When we (do not) use our talents, we take the risk of losing them. Jesus' parable teaches us, when we use our God-given talents, we are investing our talents and our lives, in the things of God, and bearing much fruit for God's Kingdom.

Remember, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver." (Proverbs 25:11 NKJV)

Prayer: "Dear God, thank you for the many gifts and talents you have entrusted to us. Help us to invest and use them wisely to help and serve others and bear fruit for Your Kingdom. Thank you, Lord Jesus, for using ordinary people to do extraordinary things in Your Kingdom. Appreciatively in Jesus' Name. Amen.



As we have entered the last quarter of the year, we have also entered our busy time for New Hope's missions. Our Moravian Day of Service project saw 34 of us putting together 70 birthing kits for the Unity Women's Desk. Also, that day, Julie Tomberlin spoke to the congregation about the work the Unity Women's Desk does for women around the world.

On Sunday October 13th, we will celebrate Mission Sunday. Josh Farmer, Development Director for Ashure Ministry, will be our guest speaker. Please plan to be there to learn about all the wonderful services Ashure offers our neighbors in need. Lunch will be provided after the service.

Ongoing collections:

- Plastic grocery bags for Ashure Ministry. They have a constant need for these bags.
- Medicine bottles for CCM. This new collection project will allow you to drop off your empty pill bottles, with labels removed, at church. These will be taken to CCM in Hickory, where they are cleaned and used in their pharmacy. This pharmacy offers qualified patients access at no cost to low-cost medications through patient assistance programs and partnerships.

Upcoming projects:

- Peanut Butter and Jelly collection in November. Plastic jars only since these items are sent home with school children in backpacks.
- Toys for Christmas on the Corner in December. We will be collecting new, unwrapped toys for children birth through 12 years of age for The Corner Table's Christmas event. The early notification is to allow members to shop early if they wish. However, please don't bring the toys to church until after Candle Tea so nothing gets misplaced in all the activity.


