"Who'll Say Grace?"

This month of November, I'd like to share with you a story by Dr. Ralph Wilson entitled "Who'll Say Grace?" Wilson writes: "A hot, glistening bird commands the laden table, as grandma calls everyone to dinner. Eight-year-old Jennifer proudly lugs her July-born sister to the table. Grandpa and dad get up slowly with a long backward glance to see the tight end catch a pass and be forced out of bounds at the twenty yard line. The game continues in the background without them."

"Who'll say grace?" grandma asks. Grown-ups look awkwardly at each other in strained silence. Finally Uncle John snickers and parrots the word "grace," and laughter spills over the tension. Grandma steps in. "Jennifer, why don't you say the prayer you learned in Sunday School when you were in kindergarten." She recites. and then their feast begins." (*Dr. Ralph F. How many of you around the Thanksgiving Day dinner table find yourself...with embarrassed silence or without even a blessing of thankfulness being said at the mealtime. Sometimes, in our haste, even Christians take little time to give God thanks for all they are blessed to have...even on Thanksgiving Day. Oh, I know, there's lots of talking and confusion with all the family; after all, we're grateful. But, think what a witness you can be to those who share this special "turkey day" bounty. What a witness you are to how grateful you are for all God has given you. Clearly, giving thanks--is an expression of our gratitude and thankfulness to God for the abundance we've received through-out the year! Yet, it's too often absent from our holiday tables; people eat and forget their need to "say grace."

We read, in Matthew 15:16, Jesus "took the seven loaves and the fish, and when he had given thanks, he broke them and gave them to the disciples." In Matthew and Mark, at the Last Supper Jesus took bread and gave thanks, lifted the Cup, gave thanks and offered it to His followers. Jesus always prayed before meals.

We can, too; it's what we're called to do. A simple prayer of thanksgiving at each family meal of the year will gradually restore our hearts to one of gratitude and thankfulness. Then as our children and others see us humble ourselves to thank our Creator, they too learn to be grateful and appreciative of all we have. Robert Lintner says it well: "Thanksgiving was never meant to be shut up in a single day."

The habit of family thankfulness can begin around all our tables this Thanksgiving--perhaps, the first of many prayers of thanksgiving to be offered, in the future, not just by Jennifer, but by her thankful mother and father and all of us, as well.

What are you most thankful for this year? Tell God, He already knows, but He still wants to hear! Perhaps, you need to make a list and then come Thanksgiving Day, you will be prepared to "Say Grace!" Then, there will be no question of "Who's Saying Grace?" at your Thanksgiving Day dinner table.


