Giving Grace ... At Thanksgiving and Any Time

How many of you when you gather around the *Thanksgiving Day* table find yourself... with uncomfortable silence? Or perhaps without even a blessing of gratitude being said at mealtimes. Sometimes, in our haste, even Christians (take too little time) to give thanks for all they are blessed to have... even on *Thanksgiving Day*. Oh, I know, there's lots of loud talking with all the family coming in for the special event. After all, we really are grateful... Aren't we??

But think about it, when we say "grace" what a witness we can be to those who share this special "turkey day" bounty with us. Telling God how grateful we are, and giving thanks is an expression of our gratitude to God for the abundance we've received throughout the year! Yet too often it's absent from our holiday tables; People eat and forget their need to say "grace."

Sometimes, "grace" is absent from our meal gatherings, not because people forget or are ungrateful but because they're uncomfortable praying aloud. Saying grace before a meal, whether you're the host or guest, can be terrifying. Because the number one thing most people fear is public speaking: even among their closest family members and

friends. They don't want to mess up and there's a measure of stress to make their prayer sound elegant and perfect.

Yet, I agree with one young boy who repeatedly asked after his prayers: "How'd I do Mom?" She'd always tell him he did great." Then he'd respond, "I ask Mom, just in case I messed up. After all, I'm talking to God. I really want to get it right! I don't want to be a bad pray-er?" Yes, he's right, we are talking to God, and no one wants to be "a bad pray-er"; But any prayer is a good prayer.

So, what if we mess up while we're praying? We all, like the young boy, have felt the pressure to get it just "perfect". I remember years ago when I struggled with my prayers and speaking in public. But I also remember that even in my times of fear, I took it to God. I ask for His mercy and grace to be upon me and give me the words to say. After all, I was talking to God, and what I was praying and saying was coming from my heart. I was not trying to impress others. Finally, I slowly got over my fear, and now I rejoice at every opportunity I have to pray and give thanks.

I advised people who struggle with the fear of praying or speaking to first write out what they want to say in advance and even practice it. By the way, there's nothing wrong with doing that, it doesn't make your words any less authentic or less spiritual. Like public speaking, praying aloud gets easier the more you do it. There's never a bad time to say prayers of thanksgiving to God!

In Matthew 15:16, Jesus "took the seven loaves and the fish, and when he had given thanks, he broke them" and gave them to the disciples. In Matthew and Mark, at the Last Supper, Jesus "took bread and gave thanks, lifted the Cup, gave thanks", and offered it to His followers. Jesus always prayed before meals. We should too! It's what we're called to do. A simple prayer of thanksgiving at family meals will gradually restore our hearts and the hearts of others to be filled with gratitude and thanksgiving. We are setting an example of our "gratefulness" before others.

Philippians 4:4-9 NIV states: <sup>4</sup> "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! <sup>5</sup> Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. <sup>6</sup> Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable — if anything is excellent or praiseworthy — think about such things. <sup>9</sup> Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me or seen in me — put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

Don't forget: There are "no bad pray-ers" ... Saying Grace... and Giving Thanksgiving to God was never meant to be done on just one single day, but every single day of our life. Amen.

#### Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow!

The Board of World Mission's Blessings Flow Project has provided clean water to over 400 families in the La Moskitia region of Honduras this year through the distribution of household water filters. Through a partnership with local leaders and an organization called One Atta Time, we have blessed every family in the villages of Tumtum Tara and Warunta, with plans to serve three additional communities in the first stage of the project.

As we approach the end of the year, now is the best time to let the Blessings Flow! Our partners at One Atta Time are graciously extending the price of \$50 per filter to our Moravian donors through the end of the year, despite having increased their general rate to \$100 this summer. This means that by giving before December 31st, the impact of your donation will be doubled!

Your \$50 donation covers the cost of purchasing the filter, shipping costs to get it in country, the purchase of the bucket, visits by BWM and One Atta Time staff to do health assessments, filter distribution, training on how to use and maintain the filter, and a follow-up visit to measure impact and ensure continued proper usage. That's a lot of value to give EVERY family in these communities a decade or more of clean water to limit days of work and school lost to the effects of water-borne illnesses!



# Financial Update for Third Quarter 2023

To keep the congregation more informed the Board of Elders is giving a quarterly update on our financial status. Some months are higher in expense since we pay for some items once a year, like insurance.

Our monthly budget for 2023 is \$10,913.00. The following reflects what our monthly giving and exact expenses were for the second quarter of 2023:

July	\$10,350.00	\$11,319.00
August	\$10,049.00	\$11,122.00
September	\$11,856.00	\$ 9,340.00

During the year so far, our contributions have stayed up with actual expenses. This has been a blessing, and we hope it continues.

As recommended by the Worship Committee and approved by the Board, the offering plates will continue to be positioned in the back and not passed in the pews. The reason for this is that many give their donations once a month or even as much as for an entire year at one time. This leaves very few who give weekly. We are used to placing our offerings in the plate as we enter prior to the service. This can be revisited in the future as needed.

Please continue to prayerfully consider your giving. There are several ways now to give that offers you more convenience:

- 1. Drop off your donation in the offering plate as you enter the Sanctuary.
- 2. Drop a check in the mail preferably to: New Hope Moravian, C/O Mark Bumgarner, 2249 Dove St, Newton, NC 28658 (the church mailbox is not monitored regularly)
- 3. Donate online option: To New Hope via credit card or direct debit (automatic bank to bank transfer). The Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA) provides the portal for this electronic giving, and they directly deposit any funds to the New Hope bank account.
