The Greatest Story Ever Told!

Have you ever stop to think how *"Christmas is full of surprises and new discoveries?"* Somewhere in my reading this week I ran across this statement: While it may be true; it doesn't have to always be true. Christmas poses a challenge to those of us who have heard the story since we were children. After you have attended 30 or 40 Christmas pageants, heard and sung the same Christmas carols, listened to many Christmas sermons, and

watched the miracles of Hallmark's Christmas movies we could ask, "What's left to be said that hasn't already been said, sung, or acted out before?"

After all, if you know about Christmas at all, you know about Mary and the angel Gabriel, about the dangerous journey to Bethlehem, about Caesar's decree, about Herod's insane jealousy, about the inn with a "No Vacancy" sign, about the angels and the shepherds, and about the mysterious Wise Men from the east, and the last-second flight into Egypt. All of these stories are so familiar that perhaps, when we hear them again and again, we don't really hear them at all because we've heard them all before. We hear but...we don't hear. This can indeed be a problem. Familiarity can breed a casual lack of interest. During the season of Advent, I strive each year, to learn and discover something new. The story of "Jesus" birth is full of unexpected miracles, all unwrapped for us to see; if we will only allow ourselves, yet another year to hear the greatest story, ever told to all mankind: *"That God the Father sent His Beloved Son Jesus to invade human history in the form of a tiny, helpless baby."*

So, today, I'm saying, "ready or not" the season of Advent's unfolding miracles is upon us! We also start a new Church calendar year reflecting on the meaning of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, suffering, death, and resurrection; all done for us. In the season of Advent we focus on the threefold coming of Jesus Christ to the world in the flesh (fully God but fully human in every way). We reflect on God's holy Word. At this time each year we should ask ourselves the question the great Reformer Martin Luther asked as he pondered the rich meaning of the Christmas story, "Why would the Lord of all the universe care enough about us mortals to take our flesh and share our woes?" (Roland Bainton (ed.), Martin Luther's Christmas Book (Minneapolis: Fortress Press, 1948), 5).

Year after year, we are all told by our parents, our grandparent, our preachers, and our teachers, *"There are no bad questions or lack of new discoveries."* While this may be true, it is also true some questions and discoveries serve a greater purpose than others. So, *"Why did God care enough about us mortals to take on our flesh and share our woes?"* I believe in this question, we discover two vitally important purposes in our life.

First, during Advent, we need to move beyond the manger and connect the dots to the Cross of Jesus Christ...When we do this; we discover that it draws us into a closer personal relationship with our Creator. I've always admired Luther's passion and his way with words...He often said, *"The manger and the Cross are made of the same wood."* What does he mean; my take on this is...They are both made by wood stained with the blood of the sin and disobedience of God's creatures. They are also stained with the sweat and tears of our personal God who cares about his entire creation. God the Father's sovereign care and compassion is presented in His action and decision to send His Beloved Son, Jesus and bridge the gap between us and Himself. Sadly, God's human creations like Adam and Eve, and yes even us, have at times brought distance and separation between us and our Creator. At times, we have tried to go our own way and therefore, we have forgotten to hear, heed, listen, and obey God's Precepts.

The second purpose served by asking the question, "Why would the Lord of all the universe care enough about us mortals to take our flesh and share our woes?" It leads us to consider all the ways in which God comes to us. The season of Advent gives us four weeks prior to Christmas Day; to not just focus our eyes only on the tiny baby Jesus cradled in the manger, but to open up God's Word and discover all the ways God comes to us. Our God splits the heavens-wide-open and comes down not just during the event, we celebrate on Christmas morning. The purpose of the season of Advent is not so the Church can transport itself back some two thousand years ago and pretend to be first century Jews who are waiting for their Messiah to be born. We live in the twenty-first century. So let us believe more firmly the truth that God has already come to us, is continuing to come to us, and will one day come back to us.

During the season of Advent, we certainly should take time within our congregation and our families to celebrate God's coming to us on Christmas morning. However, at the same time we need to embrace and recognize the fact that our God who is beyond time and space comes down to us each and every Sunday morning to deliver the fruit of His Son's crucifixion and resurrection over two thousand years ago through His Word and Sacraments. He comes to us through His living Word, through the Sacraments, and yes, even in the circumstances and people around us! Let us not forget, that each day, we receive God's promises through Christ Jesus. We receive, "Immanuel, God with us," right now! As we live in a world where human sin, suffering, and brokenness is all too evident; yet in this broken world, let us continue to seek God's peace on this earth. Therefore, it is imperative, we embrace God's promise of Jesus Christ to restore our brokenness and help us live our lives until Christ' returns for His Church. All God's promises are revealed in His creation and His victory over sin, suffering and death, and in His coming again to us in glory, just as He said. The truth that God cares enough for us mortals to take on our flesh and share our woes is shown to us in the "Greatest Story" ever told to all mankind! A story that despite how many times we hear it; I believe we are eager to hold-fast to its meaning! Its promises for us! I believe...we eagerly wait to celebrate. So, this year, let's make new discoveries of God's great love for us as we hear the "Greatest Story" ever told once again. Let us celebrate God's revelation to us through His Word and His Sacraments. As members of His Church we should equip ourselves to share this "Good News" with others who live among us, who have questions regarding suffering, and despair in the world. Let us share Advents' new discoveries as we share the "reason for the hope" we have, as we rest in peace and great assurance that our Lord Jesus Christ be coming again soon. In Christ,
