Wow! Can you believe this month we are celebrating New Hope's 39th Anniversary? Each year, I find myself reflecting on the hymn words written by Sister Weber for New Hope... They give me renewed HOPE. In the second verse (the **bold** words above) especially speak to me...They remind me of God's LEADING and my/our need to TRUST Him more. The words fill me with new HOPE and FAITH.

Our New Hope's 2022 Watchword speaks to this same richness of God's giving to each one of us His POWER, His LIGHT, and His ABUNDANCE:

"If we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." (1 John 1:7)

I don't know about you, but God's Word and particular hymns speak to me in ways that encourage and energize me. During COVID, they have spoken to me even more. They strengthen me to push forward on uncharted ground because God is ALWAYS with me.

The inspiring words of "On This Ground New Hope is Building" were written for New Hope's groundbreaking service in 1989 by E. Artis Weber, the wife of New Hope's interim pastor at the time (Rev. Herbert Weber). Sister Weber's words spoke HOPE and FAITH to New Hope in 1989, and those same words should still today give us reason for HOPE and FAITH as a congregation... as we continue to worship despite COVID.

Some may even think how we can possibly be celebrating New Hope's 39th Anniversary; the years have passed by so quickly. This pilgrimage started on December 12, 1973, when eight faithful people met at the home of Wayne and Emily Garrett. They along with the help of the Board of Homeland Missions made a unanimous commitment to organize a Fellowship in Catawba County. The Homeland Missions' records state, "this is the first Fellowship where the initiative was taken by local people."

Bless, O Lord, this congregation Come and chart this church's path;

Sister Weber clearly summarizes the need for God to BLESS His Church and GUIDE the pathway of those who find themselves on an uncharted pilgrimage together. God was truly blessing and charting the pathway of a new congregation when He gave (eight people) the monumental God-given vision to start a Moravian Church Fellowship in a community with little knowledge about the Moravians (few knew what they believed).

Yet, it was out of this divine unified vision, that God ordained these SEEDS to be planted and grown in a rural area of Catawba County. Clearly, this was a God-Size task... God had planted SEEDS of FAITH in the HEARTS of His people, now, only God could bring this God-size task to fulfillment.

New Hope was formally chartered with 44 members on February 13, 1983, "...Thy church is trusting, yielding every effort, every soul" and is filled with excitement about the opportunities for worship, community outreach and fellowshipping with family and friends. The years of transition from a God-given vision to the fulfillment (of a congregation) was not an easy task. It took deep inner FAITH and HOPE, along with lots of PRAYER. Yet with God nothing is impossible! With God's LEADING, these faithful Moravians and non-Moravians alike worked together in FAITH to establish God's Moravian Church in the rural community He had ordained for it to be established.

"Give us daily Thy direction; Fill us with new hope and faith."

In the second verse of this beloved hymn, there's the acknowledgement of prayers asking God for daily direction; prayers each day asking God for His leading, which certainly filled this small group with new HOPE and FAITH.

Standing here, facing our future
With a new hope overspread
Cov'ring us with God's own pleasure
We the Body; Christ the Head.

Today, we the New Hope congregation (still a small remnant of Moravians and non-Moravians alike) join forces and continue to also go forth with new HOPE and FAITH. We like those before us stand at the threshold of new beginnings, as we face an unsettled future as we continue to deal with a world-wide pandemic. COVID has been ruthless, and yet we at New Hope have continued to be resilient and relentless in taking the needed logistic measures to keep everyone safe. Even during a pandemic, we have continued to worship together as God's Church Body. Our prayers and the prayers of those who came before us carried us through this difficult time. Just as the faithful ones before us prayed for (God to bless and guide New Hope) and He did; God has also continued to bless and guide us on our pilgrimage.

Like the faithful ones before us desired to worship together; worshipping together is also important to us. It is not something we take lightly. We the Body of Christ, LOVE Jesus and we LOVE one another. We LOVE and WORSHIP God the Father and our Savior Christ Jesus together. For it is He who is the Chief Elder of our Church... It is He who has put His LOVE into our hearts for Him and for one another... It is God who leads us.

This God-given LOVE has transformed us into a Church family that continues to stand together, give together, and work together, and cherish together our worship time in the good times and the more difficult times. No pandemic will keep us apart for God has built His Church on a hill (in rural Catawba County) with the firm foundation of the Lord Jesus Christ. We are serving God together and He is:

"Cov'ring us with God's own pleasure, We the Body; Christ the Head.

Let us give Him all praise and glory. Amen.

Ways to Give to New Hope

Thanks to the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA), we now have an online option to donate to New Hope via credit card or direct debit (automatic bank to bank transfer). The MMFA provides the

portal for this electronic giving and they directly deposit any funds to the New Hope bank account. Here is the link to the online giving portal: https://mmfa.info/new-hope-moravian-church-north-carolina-donation-form/.

This is a great option for Friends of New Hope that no longer live in the area. These donations will be tracked for tax filing purposes. Transaction fees do apply, just under 3% for credit card transactions and \$0.75 for direct debit transactions.

The MMFA also provides a means to donate securities/stocks. Your broker transfers the securities/stocks to MMFA and the MMFA executes the securities/stocks into cash. Securities/stocks executed in this way are not subject to capital gains tax. Please contact Tom Schultz if you are interested in the process for this type of monetary transaction.
