Sincere & Authentic Worship

"Your unfailing love is better than life itself; how I praise you! I will praise you as long as I live, lifting up my hands to you in prayer" Psalm 63:3-4 (NLT).

Psalm 63 is a psalm of David, regarding a time when David was in the wilderness of Judah. Maybe you know how David felt; you find yourself today in a wilderness in great need of God's love and refuge. My advice, seek Christ Jesus with all your heart! Give Him all your cares; let Him be your safe place and secure refuge. He waits with open arms to do so!

¹ O God, you are my God; I earnestly search for you. My soul thirsts for you; my whole-body longs for you in this parched and weary land where there is no water. ² I have seen you in your sanctuary and gazed upon your power and glory. ³ Your unfailing love is better than life itself; how I praise you! ⁴ I will praise you as long as I live, lifting up my hands to you in prayer. ⁵ You satisfy me more than the richest feast. I will praise you with songs of joy." (Psalm 63:1-5 NLT)

New Hope Moravian Church History Article for the 41st Anniversary in February 2024

In honor of the 41st anniversary of New Hope as a Moravian congregation, we are reprinting this article from an earlier Newsletter that was written so well by one of our long-time members, Ann Carr and updated by Charter Member Malissa Kinney Bumgarner. Enjoy!

On This Ground New Hope is Building

On this ground new hope is building, Here upon this chosen knoll, Here Thy church is trusting, yielding Every effort, every soul. Bless, O Lord, this congregation Come and chart this church's path; Give us daily Thy direction Fill us with new hope and faith.

Standing here, facing our future With a new hope overspread Cov'ring us with God's own pleasure We the Body; Christ the Head.

The inspiring words of "*On This Ground New Hope is Building*" were written for New Hope's groundbreaking service in 1989 by E. Artis Weber, the wife of our interim pastor at that time, Herbert Weber. This hymn is relevant for us in 2016 as we reflect on New Hope's thirty-three-year presence in Catawba County.

On December 12, 1973, eight people met at the home of Wayne and Emily Garrett with the Board of Homeland Missions and made a unanimous commitment to organize a Fellowship. The Homeland Missions record states "this is the first Fellowship where the initiative was taken by local people."

Formally organized as a fellowship in January 1974, the group met weekly at First Presbyterian, Hickory and then Holy Trinity Lutheran until early 1976 when Fellowship members reached a mutual decision to discontinue. This was not considered a failure as a feature of the Fellowship Program provides that a fellowship "can be renewed at any time in the future when the need arises again."

With renewed enthusiasm coming from a new group of displaced Moravians, the Hickory fellowship was reactivated in July 1980. Meetings were held on Sunday evenings at Holy Trinity Lutheran while members remained active in other congregations. In 1982, as the fellowship grew with Moravian and non-Moravian members, The Rev. Scott Venable was installed as organizing pastor, the name New Hope was selected, and Sunday morning services were held at the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Soon after, New Hope was worshipping in its first "home" at the old Bethlehem Lutheran Church building, Hickory. "Bless, O Lord, this congregation, Come and chart this church's path".

Formally chartered with 44 members on February 13, 1983, "...*Thy church is trusting, yielding every effort, every soul*" and is filled with excitement about opportunities for worship, outreach, and family fellowship. Yearly Candle Teas and Christmas Eve Lovefeasts with the community were especially meaningful. Blessed with new members with musical talent, New

Hope's music program was launched which continues to thrive 40 years later and brings glory to God and joy to all who hear, sing, and play. A strong foundation of lay leadership among the members was established in these formative years as well.

The dream of a permanent building was realized in 1989 with groundbreaking "*upon this chosen knoll.*" Member-based construction crews led by Mark Bumgarner did major work on the building and our beautiful church was consecrated on June 3, 1990 and is located at 2897 Sandy Ford Rd, Newton 28658. Our cornerstone was placed during the dedication: "As For Me And My House We Will Serve The Lord" -- Joshua 24:15

In our new church home and "*with a new hope overspread*" we were more focused on our ministry in the broader Catawba Valley. ECCCM and Corner Table, Hospice, The Family Care Center involvement, our Vacation Bible School and CMO, Scouts, ball teams were each offering opportunities for serving, sharing God's love, and raising awareness of who these Moravians are.

Our congregation has been shaped by the combined, unique gifts of the six called and six interim Pastors who served at New Hope through these past years; along with our current Pastor: The Rev. Betty Helms. We have been joined together as a church family through the use of our gifts and talents at Eastern Catawba Cooperative Christian Ministry (ECCCM), Carolina Caring Hospice, our (twice a year) Red Cross Blood Drives, our work with the Moravian Board of World Missions (BWM), and the making of our Chicken Pies which are offered at our annual (community outreach) the Candle Tea & Bazaar. Another rich church and community blessing has been our CMO/Preschool (celebrating 30 years-2024). Our congregation has also been blessed by our celebrations of worship, Sunday School, Bible studies, weddings, births, graduations, awards, new jobs, fund raising and fellowship as well as the trials of grief, illnesses, family crises and tragedies. In addition, each of us have special memories that define our personal New Hope history.

The most challenging years began 2020 when a worldwide pandemic of Covid-19 SARs shut everything down including churches. Some members came together with Pastor Helms to plan worship in the parking lot. It was different but well received by members and church neighbors. Recording of services began and were posted on YouTube. We returned to the sanctuary following all safety guidelines by the Gov, State and Moravian Provincial Elders Conference (PEC). Examples: pews roped off for 6 ft distancing, windows open, masks required, no hymnals, disposable bulletins covered entire service and no choir. As the pandemic eased, we gradually returned to a modified version of the former normal. The safety of all our members continued to be part of decision making for several years. New Hope certainly learned to be flexible and resilient.

New Hope's Board of Elders continues to monitor the status of our community and members health through this unusual post-Covid time. Members and friends still pool their talents and resources to find ways to be together in worship in a safe way. Masks are currently optional in worship.

Highlights of 2023

New Hope Celebrated 40 Years of Ministry- On February 12, 2023

The Rev. Scott Venable, founding Pastor returned to present the message during the worship service. The Rev. Doctor Neil Routh, PEC President and former pastor at New Hope came to represent the Southern Provence. A heavy reception was held following worship with church members sharing memories. Scrapbooks from church, preschool, scouts and mementos were displayed in the vestibule.

<u>Other 2023 Highlights</u>- Moravian Board of World Mission (BWM) project of assembling water filter kits for Honduras was done right after worship with 100 made. Women's Fellowship sent \$500 to the mission board/society to cover transport cost, training, on site assessments and other costs associated with the project. Our 5:00PM Christmas Eve Lovefeast & Candlelight Service with attendance of 200 was beautiful which is an almost return to pre-Covid numbers.

2024 and Beyond

2024 will mark the 30th Anniversary of our CMO/Preschool. Plans will be made to celebrate with both the church and the preschool jointly.

As we are "*Standing here, facing our future*", Pastor Betty Helms continues to encourage us to commit to serving God more completely in all aspects of our lives and to strengthen our spiritual relationships with our Savior. In our continuing journey, may we remember the timeless words of 1989 "Give us daily Thy direction, Fill us with <u>new hope</u> and faith".

Moravian Day of Giving 2024: Unite, Give, Inspire! Tuesday, February 13, 2024

Moravians have their very own day to give an unexpected gift to their church, Moravian agencies, or ministries that are of interest to them and this year it happens to fall on New Hope's 41st anniversary. The first Day of Giving was in 2021 and last year over \$220,000 was raised in one day. However, the focus extends beyond financial gifts, emphasizing the power of unity in our community, echoing the teachings of scripture and the foundational principles of the Moravian faith. The Moravian Ministries Foundation in America (MMFA) encourages individuals, on February 13th, to use their online Giving Portal to contribute to the area that is close to your heart.

While it is easy to understand what it means to give to a specific church, what are the Moravian agencies and Fields of Interest?

- Moravian agencies There are 33 different agencies listed on MMFA's portal. These include agencies we are familiar with, like Laurel Ridge Camp, Unity Women's Desk, and Board of World Mission, and some that may be new to us.
- Fields of Interest Funds These funds allow you to align your gifts with causes that you care most about. They award grants to various institutions, including Moravian churches and agencies. Applicants that have the strongest plans that are best aligned with the purpose of the fund are given grants. The Fields of Interest cover areas like hunger, health, housing, clothing, prison ministry, violence against women, and environmental stewardship.

Donations to all the Field of Interest Funds will be matched, up to \$2,500 per fund! This matching initiative aims to amplify the impact of individual contributions, further enhancing the positive change Moravians can collectively bring about.

Don't feel comfortable with using the MMFA's Giving Portal? There is help with that. Come to the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on February 13 and someone will be there to help you donate on the Moravian Day of Giving.

News from the Mission Committee

The Mission Committee has designated the WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTER as a project for February and March. Specifically, we are asking for items for the Pantry with a Purpose.

In response to this need, the Women's Resource Center maintains a free pantry stocked with personal hygiene and cleaning supplies. At present, the most pressing need is for personal hygiene products. They have a service where women can pick up these products "No Strings Attached" 24/7.

We will begin collecting these products on Sunday, February 18 and go through Sunday, March 31. The need is so great, we will deliver items to WRC on a weekly basis.
