

This can be good or bad. Some of our life experiences were beyond our control in the early years. For some, your memories are grand. For others, the recollections are somewhat like a rushing tide that brings painful memories. Most of us find we are somewhere in the middle.

The reality is our parents did the best they could; after all, they probably did what they watched their parents do. Now, please hear me. I'm not playing the blame game. This is just how generations operate. Our family dynamics breed a lot more than just genetics. Some may suffer with financial chaos because its how their parents dealt with money. Some may turn to a bottle for relief because it's how they watched their parents deal with difficulty. Some may turn to drugs or other addictions because they witnessed this behavior as a child. Some may struggle with depression or other disorders because it has been a part of their past. Some are spiritually complacent because it was the way of life in their homes growing up. Despite trying to stop the tides of the not so good past experiences; generations still carry on habits to others. Sometimes this is a good thing and then other times it is not.

I don't know your story but I DO know all of us are likely to have unresolved issues that come from our past experiences; that are NOT productive, nor are they the way God intended our life to be. Perhaps chaos is something that looms in your past. Perhaps it's something that began with you! With me! But if we are not careful, though we hate the baggage and chaos, we'll be the carriers that pass it on to our children, the next generation. We witness this reality over and over again in Scripture. There we find both blessings and the continuation of curses.

I refuse to make my children pay for my past. I want them to live in wholeness before their God. Someone has to say enough! It stops here! So I ask you, what is that thing that continues to trip you up? What is that distortion you keep holding onto in your life? What are you doing about it? When you recognize it, surrender it to God. Daily seek His help; then things will begin to change, I promise! So be honest with yourself today. Stop procrastinating. It's a trap! It's deadly! Stop sweeping the timeless baggage and chaotic tides of your life under the rug. Lay it out before the Father. You cannot do this by yourself, and besides, why would you want to?!! The All-Powerful and All-Loving Father is accessible to you and to me this day and forevermore! So reach out to Him and ask for help. Amen....






Dear Friends,



Shrove Tuesday

The "Shrove" of Shrove Tuesday most properly refers to "being shriven", a term for confessing one's sins. It was the custom for many centuries - and still is in many places - to have personal and/or corporate Confession (the Sacrament of Reconciliation) on Shrove Tuesday as a way of preparing for the Season of Lent, which begins the following day - with 'Ash Wednesday'.

Shrove Tuesday is sometimes called 'Fat Tuesday' or 'Greasy Tuesday'. This latter is the literal meaning of 'Mardi Gras'. This peculiar name for Shrove Tuesday arose out of the fact that the Season of Lent is a season of fasting. Therefore the day before Ash Wednesday, the fat of the land - things like eggs and butter and rich sauces and dairy products - were consumed in a kind of last chance to enjoy oneself personal and/or corporate feast.

In North America among religious and non-religious alike it has been a custom to have Pancake Suppers on Shrove Tuesday. The consumption of pancakes or 'blini' (crepes) just before Lent begins is also found in the European and Eastern Orthodox traditions. Pancakes or Blini, of course, tend to use up all those products forbidden during fasting.

People could also make the connection between this clearing of the home of all products that might prove to be a temptation during the season of fasting and the Old Testament pre-Passover cleansing of houses/kitchens from leaven.

The true cleansing, of course, happens not when people gather to eat pancakes with melting butter and maple syrup - but when the faithful confess their sins, admit that they are but dust and ashes, and in humility, are ready to receive the word of God's love and forgiveness.
