How do we miss it? How do we awaken in the morning and lie down at night and not be overtaken with the enormous reality God is the Creator of the Universe. He is GOD...the Almighty One!! Yet, He is available to us in extraordinary ways! How have we lost sight of the true awesomeness of our God? Have we become so anesthetized to His greatness He no longer intrigues us and keeps us searching for spiritual significance in our lives? Have we become so accustomed to God's presence and His creation that "It's no big deal?!"

Romans 1:19-20 (NLT) states: "They know the truth about God because he has made it obvious to them. For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God."

As I read my devotional last night, I was reminded that God's faithfulness transcends our failures and trials. I recalled certain times in my life when I felt totally overwhelmed and wondered if God could see me. If He could, it seemed apparent He must not care, for I felt as though I was circling the drain and was ready to go down the pipes. Where was God when I needed Him? Do you *still* not trust my love for you? Do you *still* not know my Beloved Son Jesus...He is the reason for this season; He is the reason, I love you so; He is the reason, nothing can come between us now! He's the reason for the timeless event of Easter; He is the reason you receive My abiding Presence and My eternal love."

It is in those moments I feel most safe and secure. I still don't know how He will move or work in my life to bring about His will and purpose in my life. Yet, I just know He will...I trust Him to do so! It's during Lent I search my heart to know myself and God better. It's during this time I am always reminded God is for me! He won't let me be put to shame or destroyed. When I believe deep within my being, absolutely nothing can come against me! The ground beneath my feet is the foundation God has placed. (Jesus Christ Himself!) He will not be shaken.

Whatever it is you are facing in this Season of Lent, know you can trust God's love for you. The great Charles Spurgeon said, "When you can't trace God's hand (when you don't have a clue what He's doing!), you can always trust His heart." He loves you so...Oh, yes He does!!!

The 12th Moravian Women's Conference will be held June 25-28, 2015 at Sandy Cove Conference Center in North East, Maryland. Sandy Cove, a 220 acre retreat and Christian conference center, is located just minutes from I-95 between Baltimore and Philadelphia on the headwaters of the Chesapeake Bay. This rural setting is a great place to relax your body, mind and spirit and to enjoy swimming, putt-putt golf, canoeing, paddle boats, zip line, or just sitting in a chair overlooking the bay.

At the 12th Moravian Women's Conference, we will explore the theme "Walk in the Light", "Come...let us walk in the light of the Lord..."-Isaiah 2:5. All Moravian women are invited to the beautiful and tranquil shores of the Chesapeake Bay to explore what it means to "Walk in the Light" in today's world.

Accommodations at Sandy Cove will include triple or quad rooms with a private bath and 8 meals. There will be workshops, worship services, and wonderful keynote speakers Jennifer Sands and Rev. Dr. Craig Atwood. Early bird registration for the conference will continue thru January 6, 2015 at a fee of \$485 per person. Beginning January 7, 2015 the regular registration fee will be \$550 per person. Registration fees are non-refundable but can be switched to another woman.

Clemmons Moravian, February 11, 2014

The meeting began at 7pm with welcome and devotions by Chair Malissa Bumgarner.

Present: All members from the 5 churches present except Carl & Mike from New Phili. Two new members, Shelia Beamon of Macedonia, and Martha Rowe of Clemmons, were welcomed and introduced.

Minutes of the November 14, 2013 meeting at Unity were approved.

A report was given by the current Chair, Malissa Bumgarner. She sent reports of Yadkin View RCC activities, plans and events to BCM; attended the Nov. 21 and Jan. 16 BCM meetings; attended the "Simply Moravian: The Essentials for Educational Ministry"; attended the Moravian Leadership Team Trainings.

Malissa Bumgarner elected Chairperson, and Sharon Boger elected to serve as Secretary for 2014.

Calendars were updated and meeting dates discussed. Bimonthly meetings will be the 3rd Monday of the month. **Meeting dates**: March 17 at Macedonia; May 19 at New Hope (Pastor John Rights offered to drive the New Philadelphia bus to that meeting.); July 21 at New Philadelphia.

Goals and activities for 2014

Yadkin View RCC were discussed. An activity for women was on our list last year and has not been done. Shelia and Sharon will investigate possibilities for a women's program or event.

Pastor John Rights will coordinate a youth/family event, possibly in September. The kickoff was good last fall.

The RCC Music Festival for 2015 was discussed. Choir directors need to meet and plan for 2015 concert. It was suggested that Dennis Fort be asked to coordinate or give us advice about planning. New Philadelphia may be the only church large enough to host. It was agreed planning should begin as soon as possible.

BCM will provide topic speakers for workshops. An example is "Poverty Simulation". To host a workshop, the RCC would need forty people to participate.


The following upcoming events and news were shared:
