

Pastors Message

Celebrate Jesus Resurrection Every Day!

Well the month of April has arrived and this year Sunday April 1, 2018 ushers in Easter morning. The long awaited day for many Christians arrives; the sun rises for Easter Sunrise and then Christians later gather for their traditional Easter Morning Worship Service. At both services, I say: "The Lord is Risen! Then the congregation says, "The Lord is Risen indeed!" Easter is the day Christians all across the world celebrate Jesus Resurrection. This great day of celebration comes after, we as Christians, have experienced and traveled forty days on our lengthy Lenten journey....

We've celebrated "Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week (our readings each night), and The Upper Room on Maundy Thursday with Communion just as Jesus and His disciples came together. There we receive Jesus' words, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (Matthew 26:28NIV).

Then, as is our tradition, we celebrated our Good Friday Lovefeast; on Good Friday, we once again traveled to the foot of the Cross where, we heard, Jesus echoing cry of, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me" Mark 15:34.

On our Lenten journey this past year, we've heard the words of finality that Jesus spoke with His last breath, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). Jesus paid our sin debt in full; Jesus paid a sin debt we could not pay for ourselves. Fortunately we are no longer separated from God the Father. Our Lenten journey, also took us to the empty tomb to hear again the story of the women who traveled there early in the morning; to find the tomb empty. We heard once more the words of the angels at the empty tomb, "He is not here, but has risen" (Luke 24:6). So, now what do we do? Where do we go from here? The pivotal culmination of God's life-changing Day of Jesus Resurrection is over; or is it...?

Brothers and Sisters, Easter, is so much more than just one day. Jesus' Resurrection Day should be an essential part of every Sunday worship celebration we have. When we come together to worship on Sunday, we should come to collectively receive once more the fruit of the Cross and the Resurrection of Jesus — as we come receiving the forgiveness of our sins and the certainty of our eternal life with God. Easter should be celebrated "every day" as we live with "hope" trusting in God through Christ. "Every day" should be a day of celebration, knowing Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25). God sent His Beloved Son...Jesus Christ is our only "hope!"

So what do after celebrating the empty tomb and "Jesus Resurrection"? We follow the example of the first witnesses of the empty tomb. After the two angels reminded Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women that Jesus had risen, the Gospel of Luke tells us "they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest" (Luke 24:8-9). They went forth from the tomb changed by the Resurrection of Jesus. They went forth from the tomb to share their witness of God's power over sin, death and Satan himself; to others.

So where do we go and what do we do? We are to follow the example of Jesus' first disciples. After Jesus walked through locked doors to appear to the eleven disciples and to show himself to Thomas, seven of the eleven disciples went back to their fishing business (John 21:1-14). They went back to their vocations in life and took the witness of the Resurrection with them. They lived each and "every day" in joy and celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus by carrying out their discipleship duties and responsibilities.

Perhaps, this year, we need to stop and think how much we are like the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples; we too, are to be "every day" witnesses to the Resurrection of Jesus. As Jesus true disciples, we need to let others know of Jesus Resurrection and the hope we have of eternal life. Like the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we have vocations that avail us the opportunity to reach out to those in our homes, work-places and communities. We have been given the task of spreading the "Good News" of Jesus Christ to the world around us. God has given to each of us a special gift to share with others. Most of us are not fishermen, but all of us have a particular calling on our life. Our calling can be: father, husband, mother, wife, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandparent, employee, retiree, friend and neighbor.

We are all called to celebrate "Jesus Resurrection" by sharing God's grace and mercy; we are to celebrate and communicate it "every day" by sharing God's joy, love, peace, and forgiveness through Christ. We are to live each and "every day" with constant joy and celebration of "Jesus Resurrection." We are to share "every day" the words of our Easter Morning Liturgy and our hymn of celebration that declares Jesus Resurrection: Sing Hallelujah, Praise the Lord! Moravian Book of Worship (MBW) Page 94 & 543....

Sing Hallelujah, Praise the Lord!

Sing hallelujah, praise the Lord!
Sing with a cheerful voice;
Exalt our God with one accord,
And in His Name rejoice.
Ne'er cease to sing, thou ransomed host,
Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost,
Until in realms of endless light
Your praises shall unite.

There we to all eternity
Shall join the angelic lays
And sing in perfect harmony
To God our Savior's praise;
He hath redeemed us by His blood,
And made us kings and priests to God,
For us, for us, the Lamb was slain!
Praise ye the Lord! Amen.

Regular volunteers, Dan Greaser and Wayne Hutto, who usually work 9 to 11 a.m. would like to have others join them. Perhaps make plans to meet at the church to car pool and enjoy breakfast together before reporting to work. Assignments usually are working with staple groceries in the food pantry area. Sorting clothing donations is another area where regular help is needed.

Camp Nurses needed for Moravian Mission Camp at Laurel Ridge

Laurel Ridge is looking for a camp nurse to serve at 3 of our mission camps.

If there is someone in your congregation that may be able to volunteer a week as a nurse please contact Scarlett Dowdy Program Manager, scarlett@laurelridge.org or call 336-601-3034.

We can use EMT's, retired or active nurses, PA's, and doctors.

The weeks needed are:

MC1 June 24-30 MC2 July 1-7 MC4 July 22-28 Mission camp is housed in Higgins Lodge. The camp Nurse stays in the host room. Keeps all medicine for campers and distributes them daily as needed. Laurel Ridge keeps a supply of other over the counter medicines and band aids, etc. Assesses any injuries along with the Program Manager or Director(s) to decide if a trip to the hospital is necessary. If a camper is sick, they are sent home if they have a fever. Medical records are kept electronically and all recording is done in our registration program.
