

Are You Living For Christ?

This month of April, I decided to share one of my all time favorite stories with you concerning... Count Zinzendorf: Living for Christ – First Fruit by Janet and Geoff Benge.

Nicolaus Ludwig Zinzendorf climbed the stone steps of the art gallery in Dusseldorf. The doorman bowed low, and Zinzendorf nodded in recognition of the gesture. It was May 20, 1719, and this was the fifth art gallery he had visited since setting out on his excursion a week before. Zinzendorf strolled around, taking in the masterpieces on display. With him were his new tutor, Herr Riederer, and his older half-brother, Fredrick, who had joined him for the early portion of the grand tour of Europe. The excursion to the art gallery was much like the others Zinzendorf had made on the trip, until he came to one particular painting. For some reason he felt attracted to it. He stopped and studied it closely. The painting, by Domenico Feti, was titled *Ecce Homo (Behold the Man)*. It showed Jesus with a crown of thorns on His head. At the bottom of the picture, the artist painted the words: **This I have done for you. What have you done for Me?**

This question astonished Zinzendorf. It seemed to hang in the air as he pondered what, indeed, he had done for Christ. The usual answers came to mind. He had loved Him, read the Bible, prayed and sang hymns, but somehow these things seemed insignificant compared to all Christ had done by dying on the Cross. Zinzendorf repeated the question to himself: **What have you done for me?** His mind went back to the dining room at the Paedagogium in Halle. He thought about the time he sat at

the table listening to all that Bartholomaus Ziegenbalg, the missionary from India, had to say. **Now, there was a man who was doing something for Christ!**

"I will do more," Zinzendorf vowed quietly as he stood in front of the painting. "My life will not be spent in idle touring and visiting." "Don't you want to see the rest of the gallery?" Fredrick asked, his voice breaking into Zinzendorf's thoughts. "You've been standing here in a trance for fifteen minutes." "Oh, yes, I suppose I must go on," Zinzendorf replied, taking one last look at the painting. Zinzendorf went on to view the work of famous Dutch and German artists, but he could not get out of his mind the idea that it was time to do something for Christ.

Shortly thereafter, he caught a vision of his life's work. **What could he do for Christ?** It was so obvious to him now: he could use his life and his money to make an effort to bring all Christians together into one family - one fellowship that would accept and tolerate one another's differences. Moravian Mission Coffee



You can support Moravians around the world just by drinking a cup of coffee! Each bag of coffee purchased enables the Board of World Mission to provide more Mission Grant funding to their partners worldwide. The Board of World Mission partners with Lutheran World Relief's Farmers Market Coffee to make coffee sourced directly from the coffee farmers available to you. The farmers are paid a living wage so that they can lift themselves out of poverty and become self-sufficient.

The coffee is available as a medium roast out of Uganda (ground or whole bean), a decaffeinated option (ground only) or a hazelnut flavor (ground only). To order go to moravian.org/mission.

About The Easter Morning Service

The Easter Morning Service of the Moravians is an old service, rich in deep spiritual significance. It originated in Herrnhut, Saxony, a village which had been established in 1722 on the estate of Count Nicholas von Zinzendorf by a band of religious refugees, descendants of the Ancient Unitas Fratrum. On Easter Sunday in 1732, in the early morning hours, a group of earnest young men met by special appointment on "God's Acre" to sing appropriate hymns and to meditate upon the great fact of Christ's death and resurrection. These young men, stood among the simply marked graves, singing their songs of hope and faith, watching the sun drive the darkness from the hills and valleys and experienced a deeper appreciation of the TRUTH of the resurrection more than ever before. With this simple beginning, the holding of Easter morning services outdoors in the beauty of God's creation became an annual feature in the worship services of the Moravian Church wherever it established itself.

Here at New Hope, our Easter service is held as a service of true worship, centering on the great underlying fact of the Christian faith, THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST, through which God placed a seal of approval on Jesus' atoning sacrifice and established the TRUTH of the claims of our religion. The service offers all who attend an opportunity to renew their faith in the Risen Christ, in "the communion of saints," in "the forgiveness of sins," and in "the life everlasting."

The Graveyard - God's Acre

Moravians still call their graveyard by that significant and ancient name used by their ancestors – "God's Acre." It is a "field" in which the bodies of loved ones are buried in faith as "physical bodies," in due time to be raised as "spiritual bodies." A distinctive feature of God's Acre is the flat stone markers, symbolizing the Moravian belief in equality of death and making it impossible to distinguish between the graves of the rich and poor. Men, women, and children are each buried in separate sections of the graveyard rather than by families. This is a form of the traditional Moravian choir system (grouping members according to their station in life) instituted by Count Zinzendorf over two hundred and fifty years ago.

The Church Band and Choir

Music from the beginning has held a prominent place in the Moravian Church, both for its cultural value and its rich expression and unfolding development of the religious life. Congregational singing is one of its treasured features, along with the band playing for outdoor services, on festival occasions, and in the Moravian funeral services. Moravians love their music and its deep expression of God's love to others. In Winston-Salem, at about 2 AM Easter morning, all Moravian musicians who play in the band assemble in groups to go throughout the city playing chorales, partly to remind all listeners of the Resurrection, and partly to awaken people for the Sunrise Service at God's Acre in Old Salem. The first chorale played is "Sleepers, Wake!"

Opportunity for Service

While grateful for an honorable past, the Moravian Church is mindful of its obligation and opportunity; to earnestly fulfill its past, present, and future missions. Therefore, the Church calls upon every person to "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and be saved," to unite with a Church of choice, and be a positive Christian witness in service for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom. The HOPE of all creation relies on Jesus the Savior of the world – He is our Risen Christ. CHRIST JESUS is the HOPE of the world!

Ways to Give to New Hope

Thanks to the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA), we now have an online option to donate to New Hope via credit card or

direct debit (automatic bank to bank transfer). The MMFA provides the portal for this electronic giving and they directly deposit any funds to the New Hope bank account. Here is the link to the online giving portal: https://mmfa.info/new-hope-moravian-church-north-carolina-donation-form/.

This is a great option for Friends of New Hope that no longer live in the area. These donations will be tracked for tax filing purposes. Transaction fees do apply, just under 3% for credit card transactions and \$0.75 for direct debit transactions.

The MMFA also provides a means to donate securities/stocks. Your broker transfers the securities/stocks to MMFA and the MMFA executes the securities/stocks into cash. Securities/stocks executed in this way are not subject to capital gains tax. Please contact Tom Schultz if you are interested in the process for this type of monetary transaction.
