"Pray Without Ceasing"

"Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful." Colossians 4:2 (NIV).

At the beginning of 2024, many of us made resolutions to make some changes in the New Year. How's that going? When we made these resolutions, our intentions were good. And with the beginning of a New Year, we felt like we had hope for a new start.

However, as the months have slipped by, I am mindful that perhaps many may have forgotten the (one) most important resolution? Did we make the resolution to pray more in the New Year? Beginning a New Year brings many challenges and choices, and we can find ourselves overwhelmed with our new (to do) list. Nevertheless, in the midst of our desire to make new choices, we must never forget that our greatest desire should be to establish our daily prayer time with God. There is NOTHING more important! The word "prayer" appears 164 times throughout the books of the Bible. Scripture tells us, He is the God that hears us. He is the God with a heart who has compassion on us. He is the Almighty, loving, merciful, gracious God.

Proverbs 3:5- "Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding."

Jeremiah 29:12-13- "Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart."

Matthew 6:9-13- "Pray then like this: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil."

Matthew 18:20- "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

Mark 11:22-25- "And Jesus answered them, "Have faith in God. Truly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be taken up and thrown into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will come to pass, it will be done for him. Therefore, I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. And whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father also who is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses."

Luke 11:9-13- "And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Romans 8:26-27- "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. ²⁷ And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."

In Colossians 4:2, Paul proposes that we reframe our perspective of prayer. He calls us to see it as an authentic adventure and journey with God. Paul exhorts us to devote ourselves to prayer. He calls us to prayer without reservation. The original language interprets this word as 'strength', which means, "Invest your strength in this." Fervent prayer is not something we practice passively; it's an exercise that takes effort and determination. Prayer like anything else in life takes outright effort and dedication!

Just as we need to constantly nurture our relationship with others, so it is with God. Prayer does this because it becomes intentional—Complete prayer time is persistent prayer time. It's something God invites all of us to do daily. He calls us to draw near (to Him) and talk and communion with Him. Through prayer we develop an intimate and personal relationship with our Creator. Through regular prayer time, God gets to know us better; we also get to know God better. Therefore, prayer time is not just a resolution we make; It's a challenge for us to start living a life of faith and "pray without ceasing". This year 2024, let's decide to make regular prayer time, a priority in our lives. Let's give ourselves completely to prayer, avoiding life's trivial distractions and interruptions. This year let's intentionally choose to draw closer to God's presence each day. New Hope's Preschool Celebrates 30 Years of Outreach

Mission Statement

The mission of New Hope Moravian Preschool is to provide a loving and Christian atmosphere where children can grow and thrive in a positive, nurturing environment. We strive to meet the social, academic, and spiritual needs of each child so that we can prepare them to meet the demands of their next learning experience.

- 1992- During a church planning retreat the idea for an outreach mission of starting a half day children's program at New Hope was born.
- 1993- A volunteer committee began a one-year research project into the feasibility for us. Ex: Visited Moravian and non-Moravian Childrens Morning Out (CMO's) programs.
- 1994- In July we posted a sign out front announcing a children's morning out with phone number to call. Our summer "Pilot Program" opened July 20 with 8 students, 1 day a week and all volunteer church staff. The Pilot Program was a huge success and parents wanted it to continue!
- 1994- That fall CMO officially opened as a ½ day, year-round, 2 days a week program with paid staff and volunteer Director & Assistant. Materials and needed items were donated by church members and Women's Fellowship funds.
- 1995-Name change from CMO to Preschool due to addition of curriculum.
- The playground was expanded & fenced using Grant Funds from the Moravian Southern Province. Later updated to code using Smart Start Grant Funds & separate toddler playground area was added. 2021-major overhaul with donated & fund-raised income.
- Eventually the 2 days a week went to 3 days and changed to follow the public-school schedule with summers off.
- Later increased to 4 days a week with a transitional kindergarten room.
- Operated from day one as a structured program with emphasis on education, socialization, and school readiness in a Christian atmosphere. Chapel time in sanctuary was added.
- Outside educational programs were brought in such as the Science Center, Stretch-N-Grow, Music, Library Book Baggers to enhance our teaching. Community helpers, such as Police, Fire, Mailman, etc. visited and did little presentations. Many still come today. Field trips were made available for the older classes.
- 2010- Lunch Bunch offered. Paid extra 30 min at school with students bringing bag lunches.
- 2011- Summer Camp added June-Aug for ages preschool-6th grade with focus on fun.

Students

The program started with 8 students. Now averages 35+ using 5 classrooms, 5 teachers, 1 Director and 2 assistants. Summer Camp averages 40. Waiting lists are maintained for both. We've served students from 15+ different denominations. Have had numerous children of Minister's from other denominations. Students have been invited to any New Hope children's activities, such as VBS & Egg Hunts. Families are invited to worship services and other activities, such as Candle Tea & Shrove Tuesday Pancakes.

Administration

Preschool Director reports to the Preschool Advisory Committee which oversees the program. Advisory Committee Rep reports to the Church Board monthly. Reassurances for Parents and Staff

<u>Interior Doors</u>: NONE CLOSED for the protection of students and staff. <u>Exterior Doors</u>- Locked with doorbells. <u>Staffing</u>: Background checks and drug screenings done on all staff, including substitutes. All staff are trained in CPR/First aid with other workshops offered. <u>Facility</u>: inspected annually by the Fire Marshall and water tested quarterly.

Firsts

New Hope was instrumental in starting the first Half-Day Directors Association in Catawba County through the Partnership for Children Agency. Participated in Smart Start funded training events for staff. Wrote for and utilized Smart Start grant money for educational materials, curriculum, upgraded classroom furnishings and playground.

Impact

Increased communities' knowledge and perception of the Moravian Church, such as being a Christian Denomination. Building used rather than sitting empty all week is good stewardship. Only ½ day program in the Startown area and centrally located in Catawba County. We frequently hear from area

elementary schoolteachers who love getting our preschool students since they know our participants are school ready.

Research has shown there are long term benefits of attendance in early Ed/Preschool increasing success of high school & college graduates. Our first-year students are all grown-up, educated, some with their Master's and PhD's from NC institutions as well as Cornell and The Julliard School of Music to name a few. Many now have families of their own. How can our first-year students be in their 30's already?

Many thanks to all New Hope Moravian members and those who have been teachers or volunteered in numerous ways. Appreciation is expressed to groups like the Board of Elders, Women's Fellowship, and Chicken Pie Committee for all the support through the years. What a blessing this outreach mission project has been to countless families in our community.
