New Hope Moravian Church

Dear New Hope Family,

How many of us would feel comfortable enough to sit down with a friend and share our personal finances? I would venture to say, not many of us. In New Hope's new Sunday school class, Chip Ingram, the author of *Balancing Life's Demands*, believes our individual bank accounts reflect our values and our hearts. In his DVD series he encourages listeners to give to the Lord first (since it's all His anyway,) then pay bills, then pay ourselves, and then save.

You might ask, why in the world I am writing about what is going on in my Sunday school class. The truth is, our church board met this past month for a regular monthly meeting and discussed many things, some exciting and some discouraging. After deliberating over the budget report, the board felt like it needed to be open and honest with the entire congregation. The bottom line is our monthly budget is \$10,000, and in January, a historically good month, only \$8,262 was given. Basically we are tapping in to our reserve each month. Theoretically, at this pace, our checking account will run dry in roughly two years.

I am not really sure why I was led to write this letter to all of you, but maybe it was because I was supposed to share my personal story. If you are like Lauren and me, you live paycheck to paycheck. Church and charity giving are very tough to work in after mortgages, student loans, car payments, diapers, etc. This Sunday school class has changed our mindset; we have changed from "working in" our monetary gift to making it the first check we write.

It is safe to say Chip Ingram's study has touched everyone in the Sunday school class. His series does not focus solely on money, however, but also our life's priorities and having personal relationships with God. I know not everyone can give more money, but with a closer relationship with God, we can give a lot more than just our treasure. If you are just showing up on Sunday for worship then you are missing out on how our church can touch your life and the lives of others. I encourage everyone to get more involved. We need your attendance at committee meetings, and we need your presence at the special events for our youth, and our women's and men's gatherings. We need you in Sunday school as teachers and students. And if there is not a program that fits you, start a new one...somebody else probably feels the same way.

My intent is not to guilt anyone into opening your wallet wider to the church. New Hope has a long history of pulling together and helping each other and our neighbors in the community. When there is a need, we somehow always deliver. But with dwindling resources, our ministry and outreach will suffer. In order for us to keep our mission alive, we have to grow, not just in numbers or even financially, but also in spirit. There are going to be some new and exciting opportunities coming soon. The board encourages and challenges each member to embrace these opportunities and discover what New Hope can do for you, with you, and because of you.

The theme for Moravian Music Sunday is music of living North American Moravian composers and we will sing several hymns in the hymnal whose texts were written by living Moravians. The anthems/special music done by the Chancel Choir, Children's Choir and New Hope Ringers on April 28th will be some of the pieces that will be used for the RCC Festival of Music at New Philadelphia Moravian on the afternoon of May 5th. The children will sing a song of thanks with a calypso feel and the New Hope Ringers will ring a piece that can use about 60 bells (but we only have 25 bells here at New Hope). We'll be ringing at the festival with ringers from 4 other churches.

For the festival we hope to have a combined choir of 60 to 75 singers and we'll be singing a couple of pieces that require many voices. On April 28th we plan to sing the other pieces we've been practicing which include our own *Come, Christian, Join to Sing* and a high-energy gospel piece *Praise His Holy Name!* as well as a Moravian anthem originally composed by Johannes Herbst, a prolific composer and copyist of choral music from the 18th and 19th centuries. There will also be congregational singing and music from New Philadelphia's group, the Beracah Band.

After your preview on April 28th just imagine how wonderful the music will be with the sounds of so many singers, ringers and brass band players on May 5th and make your plans to be there for the RCC Festival of Music. On another note, on the day of the Festival, New Philadelphia will take care of the ushering for the service but would like to have several greeters from the other participating churches. If you would like to be a greeter, please mention this to Phyllis Little.



Starting Sunday May 19 @ 5:00PM in the Fellowship Hall

# **Yadkin View RCC Spring Meeting**

*Present*: Representatives from all Churches and special guest Pastor Doug Rights.

The meeting began at 7:05 with a welcome by Pastor Ray Burke. Devotional was Daily Text & Prayer by Pastor Betty Helms of New Hope. As this was the first meeting of 2013, Church and new member introductions were done: Lynn Huss-Unity, Steve Bumgarner-New Hope, Karl Stimpson-New Philly, and Pastor Betty Helms-New Hope. September 2012 meeting minutes from New Hope were reviewed and approved.

The responsibilities of RCC chairperson was reviewed next. Malissa Bumgarner was nominated and elected chairperson for 2013. She will serve as our representative to the Board of Cooperative Ministries (BCM).

# **Old Business**

#### **Moravian Festival Recap:**

Mike Sloan gave a recap of the Moravian Festival. It was a successful festival, even with the storm that blew through in the afternoon. Over 150 vendors and displays were at the festival, and that number included more than 45 churches represented. Volunteerism was up with about 275 assisting to make the day a success. Left over event specific T-shirts are being donated to Haiti, and an orphanage. The balance will go to Sunnyside Ministries. The generic Moravian sweat-shirts have been given to Laurel Ridge for sale at the Higgins Lodge. Mike, his committee and New Philadelphia were commended for all their work and hosting this wonderful event. There is no festival planned for 2013, but plans are to have the festival again in 2014. Folks from New Philadelphia are in the process of helping get a committee together from various Moravian congregations. Also, a venue for the festival is needed. Mike reported that planning will need to start by January of 2014 in order to be able to hold a festival in that year.

#### **RCC Moravian Music Festival:**

Dennis Fort reported on progress toward the RCC Moravian Music Festival to be held at New Philadelphia on May 5th. They have had several meetings of the music directors involved, and the music has been selected and distributed to the choirs, who are practicing hard in preparation. On May 4th, there will be rehearsals of the bell choir at 10:30 am, and the adult choir at 2:00 pm, at New Philadelphia. The concert, on the 5th, will include a band prelude beginning at 2:30 pm, an organ prelude at 2:55 pm, and concert music to begin at 3:00 pm. There will be a love offering collected during the service. Mike Sloan moved that the offering be designated for Board of World Mission work in Cuba and Peru. Motion was seconded by Ann Graham and passed. Mike also asked for bell choirs to bring their own table pads to use during the rehearsal and service. Dress for the concert will be dark bottoms and white tops, with no ties. The bulletin will be made by New Philadelphia. They need a description if each church ASAP.

Dennis asked that everyone encourage their church to announce event in their bulletins and newsletters. It was further suggested every church in the province be invited, and PEC as well as BCM could get brochure or bulletin inserts out right away.

Ann Graham to contact Board of World Missions for a display about the mission work in Cuba and Peru for the vestibule during the music festival.

It was decided that no refreshments to be served afterwards since there will be refreshments at the Board of World Missions event held that same evening at 5:00 pm at Calvary Moravian.

## **New Business**

#### **Golf Tournament:**

There is still interest in organizing a golf outing among the churches in our RCC. Some of the golfers at New Hope have expressed a willingness to help put this together. It was expressed by the group that the fall of the year would be a good time. Mike asked if we could check into Rock Barn as a possible site. Also, Salem Glens and Bermuda Run West have been good venues for golf outings in the past. This would be organized more with the idea of Moravian fun and fellowship among the RCC golfers, and not as a tournament. Steve Bumgarner agreed to get with the interested parties at New Hope, begin research and report back to the group.

#### **Meet The PEC Event:**

There is still much interest in a "Meet the PEC" event for our RCC. Other RCCs held these around a dinner (usually with each congregation preparing some part of the meal), followed by a presentation from the PEC and a Q & A session.

It was well-received where it was done. The PEC made a commitment to be available for these types of events. It works better if the RCC comes to the PEC with dates and then move forward. The PEC needs a few months notice. It was decided we would line this up for fall. To be discussed further at next meeting.

#### **Other New Event Ideas:**

Dennis Fort reported that there are a number of speakers available for a possible RCC sponsored weekend type seminar. The member RCC participants would need to pay for the cost to get one, but spread over enough participants wouldn't be that much per person.
