# New Hope Moravian Church

Moravian Music Sunday - May 18, 2014

Moravian Music Sunday is celebrated on **the fifth Sunday of Easter** and this year it falls on **May 18.** Each year the Moravian Music Foundation selects a theme such as the work of a past Moravian composer, the works of living Moravian composers, or Moravian women text and hymn writers among others. This year the theme if *Life with the Savior, Now and Forevermore* where the music, scriptures and liturgies for the day may be focused on this central theme. The works of non-Moravian composers are used also as well as folks in the local congregations who are musically gifted in singing, playing or composing. It is a Sunday set aside to celebrate music in the church and in our lives.

When I came to New Hope four years ago as your music director, a gentleman remarked to me, "We Moravians love our music!" and I realized his statement was true in just a few short weeks. I, too, love music for it has been a gift from God in my life since age seven when I first began piano lessons after school. Moravians celebrate music as part of worship services every Sunday in general worship, in the many lovefeast celebrations, in many festival services and one Sunday during the church year is specifically set aside to observe that celebration.

Music is a gift from God, often expressing things we know but cannot put into words. Music expresses all the joys and sorrows in our lives as well as all the deep feelings. Singing together in worship and playing instruments together unites us as a living community of brothers and sisters in Christ. In our music we praise God and share in joy of making music with each other. It involves our whole person, body, mind, spirit and soul.

Our music making is a reminder of this one particular aspect of life in the reign of God: none of us is complete alone. We need each other's voices and instruments for the music to be complete for the music of all is much greater than any we can make alone. This also is God's gift to us in Christ: our life in community. Listening to others sing or play isn't enough and we should not wait until we think we are "good enough" to sing or play. Our worship, our praise, our singing, our playing, our best efforts where we are now is pleasing to our Lord and Savior. I have sometimes remarked to the choirs that God doesn't expect perfection; He just expects us to do our best.

On this Sunday set aside for us to celebrate and recognize the value music plays in worship and in our lives, let us be thankful to God for this marvelous gift which draws us closer to our God and to one another. Through music may we learn to love our Savior more deeply and to love one another more fully. To God be the glory and thanks be to God for music!
