Waiting on God

So often, we are committed to what we think God is doing in our lives. God has a plan; however, not necessarily the same plan we have. Extended through Friday, May 8, 2020

Preventing Illness

The Steps to Prevent Illness suggested by the Centers for Disease Control are still important:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.
- Wear a cloth face cover when you are around other people.
- Maintain social distancing in public 6 feet between yourself and others.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces and objects daily.


