Recently, I was going through some paperwork from my Seminary days, and I found this declaration and commitment of a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ; it was penned by a young Pastor in Africa and tacked to a wall in his house. As I read his declaration, I was reminded of God's great love and devotion toward us; His compassion and loyalty toward us. I was also reminded of God's sustaining power and strength; His encouragement in our times of doubt and fear; His faithfulness during our times of struggles and trials. Hopefully, we will never have to experience the persecution this young Pastor endured (day after day), and yet, he kept the faith. He determined to be a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ; no matter the cost. Unwavering each day, he lived this declaration of deep faith, despite his circumstances.

My Commitment as a Christian

Parking Lot Worship Service

We are now parking facing God's Acre. When arriving you will be given individual consecrated elements for the service and an order of worship. Please feel free to worship in your cars or in the shaded yard, remembering distancing of 6 feet.

There will also be a gloved and masked Parking Lot Helper giving you the bulletin and will assist you in dropping your offering (if you feel so lead) into the designated container. You may do this as you enter or exit.

You will be directed to a specific parking space with an X on it by Parking Lot Helpers. <u>It is</u> <u>important that you follow the Parking Helpers instructions.</u> We have designed a specific way to park for the protection of all. Cars **cannot** be parked side by side - must be 6 feet apart.

Members/guests are not to get out of their cars without a mask per PEC.

- Those desiring to bring a chair can sit beside their car/truck or up under the shade of the trees near the graveyard or the graveyard sidewalk. The speaker system is loud enough that you will be able to hear. Be sure to space 6 ft apart. For the safety of all we ask that you wear mask.
- Remember to face the graveyard. Pastor Betty will be on a platform near the graveyard this time. More can be in the shade this way.

<u>We CANNOT stress this enough:</u> there is to be NO co-mingling with others without practicing safe distancing (6 feet) and being masked. This is for the safety of ALL who are attending our worship service. To violate this, could mean we will not be able to continue worshipping in our parking lot. We are doing this for the safety of ALL!

The Church will be locked – no access to bathrooms.

Please know if you choose not to attend the Parking Lot Worship Service that is okay too; it may not be for everyone. We ALL want to worship but do not want anyone to not feel safe.

We are making every effort to follow all the guidelines of the CDC and the North Carolina restrictions of Gov. Cooper's (Phase Two) guidelines and the PEC restrictions. Doing the Parking Lot Worship Service (outside) right now is our only safe option for ALL safety needs to be met.

<u>Weather:</u> This can be our friend or our foe...Sprinkling rain? Possibly use easy to put up tent. Heavy Rain- bad weather- No service


Blood Drive New Hope Moravian Church
