Mid-Summer Patriotic Celebration

Well, it's that time of the year for our mid-summer patriotic celebration. For many, the Fourth of July is filled with parades and picnics, grilled hot dogs and hamburgers, watermelon, and of course always a staple for hot summer celebrations: ice cream. The adoption of Jefferson's Declaration in 1776 took place during one of the best weather weeks of the year. And so still today, we along with many other people observe this tradition along with many other traditions deeply rooted in Americana.

What does this celebration mean to us as Christians? As Christians and followers of Christ, our most significant identity lies in our relationship with our "Chief Elder- Jesus Christ! Yes, we're Americans but through Christ, our first allegiance belongs to God! We belong to God's family and "In God We Trust!" Yes, we have loyalty to our country, but no loyalty is greater than our loyalty to God. No man can serve "two masters" both God and country. In Christ, we have one ultimate allegiance; thus, while on this earth, we will always remain pilgrims, strangers and aliens, sojourners and exiles (1 Peter 2:11). This is not our home, at the most basic level, "our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ to return one day! Philippians 3:20-21 states, "transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself." We belong to Christ Jesus above all! When all is said and done at the end of the day, we are sons and daughters of God; no other!

What am I saying here? We as Americans pledge our allegiance to the flag and we sing the anthem together; we enjoy the celebrations of food, parades, and the fireworks together. But no allegiance can run as deep as knowing Jesus sacrifice for us on the Cross. The blood of Jesus love covers a "multitude of sins!" I John 4:8 says, "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins." God is pleased when we as Christians, honor His creation and are patriotic and have a special love for others and our country. Creator God made this country and therefore we are to be the care-givers of this country; we are to protect and defend as God would have us to do!

Given the fallen condition of our world today with all the human sin, we should be amazed how much common goodness God continues to create and uphold in nations good and even bad. In the same breath Paul instructs Christians to be good citizens — "to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people" (Titus 3:1–2) — he also reminds us about our human condition: "For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy"(Titus 3:3–5).

So, am I against the "Fourth of July Celebration?" Absolutely not...NO!!! I love our mid-summer celebration. We in the United States have great reason to celebrate. We can still legally speak about our faith without fear of being put in jail or beheaded. We can evangelism and proselytize freely. This is a glorious liberty. Let's make the most of it. Let's never forget the past, present and future country built on "In God We Trust."

C.S. Lewis said this: "If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world. If none of my earthly pleasures satisfy it, that does not prove that the universe is a fraud. Probably earthly pleasures were never meant to satisfy it, but only to arouse it, to suggest the real thing. If that is so, I must take care, on the one hand, never to despise, or to be unthankful for, these earthly blessings, and on the other, never to mistake them for the something else of which they are only a kind of copy, or echo, or mirage. I must keep alive in myself the desire for my true country, which I shall not find till after death; I must never let it get snowed under or turned aside; I must make it the main object of life to press on to that country and to help others to do the same." (Mere Christianity)

If we all took these words more seriously this "Fourth of July" the Star-Spangled Banner might fly more highly over our Independence Day celebrations with our family and our friends; God's country would and could be changed for the better for all people. This Independence Day, let's be more grateful and thankful for the freedoms we have in this country to recruit others to the Lord Jesus Christ; let's seize the moment, and no longer be afraid or ashamed to share our faith with others! We should all desire the essentials of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. So this Independence Day, let's show the world around us where our life, liberty, happiness and "great joy" comes from: Through Christ our Lord and Savior; No other. May God continue to Bless the United States of America...And may we continue to proclaim by faith to all people "In God We Trust!"
