How's Your Spiritual Self-Concept?

"The most important one [commandment]," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these" Mark 12:29-31(NIV).

It may seem strange to you, but if I were to give you nine affirmations and one criticism, chances are...you would hear that one criticism rather than the nine affirmations. The one criticism is what would resonate in your thoughts and mind. This is because most of us don't have a perfect self-image. If we did, criticism would rarely bother or upset us.

Psychologist Dorothy Briggs wisely points out that the way we feel about ourselves affects our entire life: happiness, marriage, parenting, work, personal relationships, leadership, creativity, stability and even our health. In other words, one's self-concept is the mainspring that steers every individual to success or failure. How we look at our self and what we think of our self speaks volumes. Therefore, having a healthy self-concept is one of the greatest gifts we can seek for ourselves and pass on to our children.

One's self-concept is basically comprised of three parts: (1) Self-image: this is how we picture or see ourselves; (2) Self-esteem is how we feel about ourselves; and (3) Self-worth is how much we value ourselves. All of these add up to our level of self-acceptance and loving ourselves. Unfortunately, as long as we continue to struggle to accept and love ourselves, it remains difficult for us to believe that anyone else could love and accept us; for us.

It's hard to believe that King David, the greatest king in Israel's long history, with all his power, riches and fame, at times struggled and felt downcast. King David in Psalm 119:28 (*NKJV*) said this, "My soul melts from heaviness; strengthen me according to Your word." Many, if not most of us, at one time or another have probably gone through dark times. The cause can vary, from the loss of one's job, the loss of a loved one, the loss of one's home, the loss of one's financial status, or the loss of one's health. There are a number of losses or negative circumstances that result in us questioning our self-image, our self-esteem, our self-worth and yes, even our spiritual self-concept.

Experiencing negative self-concepts or negative emotions can cause havoc with one's life, affecting both our emotional and physical health. A negative self-concept or negative emotion when repressed affects our whole being as King David said, "My soul melts from heaviness..." But notice what he asks God to do for him. David said, "Strengthen me according to Your word." David realized without God's intervention, his life would remain empty...hopeless. He'd be left in the abyss of his own self-made darkness.

God did not mean for King David or for any of us to question or doubt our self-concept or our self-worth; or for our souls to melt from heaviness. We are the apple of God's eye and when He looks at us, He sees us through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. No believer of Jesus Christ will ever be put to shame. The self-concept of shame and rejection, we feel is self-inflected, not God inflected. God is Sovereign; He doesn't make mistakes or junk. He made you to be a clean and pure vessel for His will and purpose.

Therefore, we, like King David, need to seek God with our whole being. Nothing can fill the emptiness within us but God; God made us to be Heavenly creatures so anything less than holiness will not fill the abyss within us. Only God the Father can empty the abyss of shame and darkness within us. Only God can reprogram our negative mindset, when it comes to our self-concept, our self-image, and our self-worth. The important thing is for us to ask God to help us do something about this negative mindset. Be it physical, relational, emotional, or spiritual. Putting it off rarely, if ever, resolves anything, it only prolongs the pain and prevents healing. Friends, for us to be restored, we must confess our sins and shortcomings to God, and then, let the Holy Spirit work in our lives to heal and restore us. God the Father's design for each of us was to be self-love and acceptance. God does not make mistakes and He does not make junk. Remember, God has created you for His divine purpose; God has great things in store for you. I'll close with David's petition to God; this could also be our petition:

Psalm 70(NIV): <sup>1</sup> Hasten, O God, to save me; come quickly, Lord, to help me. <sup>2</sup> May those who want to take my life be put to shame and confusion; may all who desire my ruin be turned back in disgrace. <sup>3</sup> May those who say to me, "Aha! Aha!" turn back because of their shame. <sup>4</sup> But may all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; may those who long for your saving help always say, "The Lord is great!" <sup>5</sup> But as for me, I am poor and needy; come quickly to me, O God. You are my help and my deliverer; Lord, do not delay." And all God's people say: "Yes, come deliver us O God from ourselves and from others"...Amen!

# Introducing July's Hymn of the Month "God Reveals His Presence" Tune: Arnsberg # 554 Moravian Book of Worship

The text for *God Reveals His Presence* was written by Gerhard Tersteegen (1697-1769), one of three most important hymnwriters of the Reformed Church in Germany. He was a pious and useful mystic of the 18th century. Carefully educated in his childhood, Tersteegen was apprenticed to his shopkeeper brother in 1715. Religiously inclined from his youth, he lived a life of seclusion and self-denial until about age thirty when he began to write devotional material and to preach both privately and publicly. He wrote about one hundred and eleven hymns, most of them published in his *Sprirtual Flower Garden* in 1731. *God Reveals His Presence* was first published in Tersteegen's *Geistliches Blumengarthlein*, 1729.

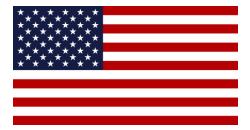
Tersteegen's text was translated in 1789 by Fredrick William Foster (1760-1835) who was born in England and eventually became a minister and provincial superintendent of the Moravian Church. He was editor of the **Moravian Hymn Book** published in 1801 and revised in 1826. Foster translated 16 hymns that appear in **Moravian Book of Worship**.

The tune name Arnsberg (also known as Wunderbarer Konig) was attributed to Joachim Neander (1650-1680) born in Bremen, Germany. In his youth Neander took religion lightly, living an unruly, carefree life, before coming under the influence of two ardent Pietists --- Jakob Spener and Johann J. Schultz. He later became headmaster of a grammar school and also an unordained assistant to a German pastor. He died at the age of thirty due to tuberculosis.

Arnsberg is the name of a town in western Germany.
