But sometimes our questions are complicated, and the answers can be even more difficult to see and harder to articulate. How do we discover and examine the truths that give meaning and purpose to life? Adam Hamilton believes that some

powerful answers are contained in the Apostles' Creed, an early statement of foundational Christian beliefs.

In this six-week study for Lent, Easter, and beyond, Hamilton considers important questions of life, reality, and truth. He explores not only what Christians believe, but also why they believe it and why it matters.

The DVD contains six video segments of 12-15 minutes each, featuring Adam Hamilton in an informal setting with a group of seekers and believers. The videos, when combined with the six book chapters, make an ideal 6-week group study. All video sessions are closed captioned.

August Cleaners: NEEDED



Introducing August's Hymn of the Month
"How Like a Gentle Spirit"
Tune: Sursum Corda
459 Moravian Book of Worship

C. (Charles) Eric Lincoln (1924-2000), an African-American scholar, wrote the text for *How Like a Gentle Spirit* in 1987. Lincoln was born in Athens, Alabama and was raised by his grandmother after being abandoned first by his father and later by his mother. He worked and studied in Chicago, eventually earning degrees in Sociology and Philosophy, then a Bachelor of Divinity degree at the University of Chicago. In 1957 he was ordained a Methodist minister and with further study obtained a Masters Degree in Education and a PhD in Socio Ethics. He was a poet, a hymnwriter, and the author of several books, including sociological works and fiction. He taught at universities in Georgia, Oregon and New York. And from 1976 to 1993 Lincoln taught religion and culture at Duke University in Durham, NC. In 1990 he was cited by Pope John Paul II for "scholarly service to the church."

The tune Sursum Corda was written in 1941 by Alfred Norton Smith (1879-1971) from Pennsylvania. He earned Bachelor of Divinity and Bachelor of Sacred Theology Degrees at the Philadelphia Divinity School and was an ordained Episcopalian deacon and priest. He served several churches and was a chaplain in the U.S. Army during World War I. Following the war he served in Philadelphia at the Episcopal City Mission and as chaplain at a penitentiary in addition to several schools. He also served as an associate priest. As an adult, Smith studied harmony and violincello. Besides some hymns and carols, he composed two masses -- one in 1936 and another in 1948.

The tune name "Sursum Corda" comes from a Latin term meaning "Lift up your hearts." The Sursum Corda is the opening dialogue to the Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer in the liturgies of the church, dating back to the third century. The Sursum Corda tune also appears in **Moravian Book of Worship** on page 766 with the text for *O Christ, Who by a Cross*.
