August In Moravian History ~ August 13, 1727

In Moravian history, some stories bear repeating again and again... In August, we are reminded through our recorded history that Moravians were strong followers of John Hus, a fifteenth century Czech priest/reformer. Hus, as we celebrated (606 years) with Holy Communion this past July was burned at the stake in 1415 for disobeying the Catholic Church and preaching his sermons in the local Bavarian dialect. Almost completely wiped out by persecution during the Thirty Years War (1618-1648), a small band of Moravians found refuge in Saxony (East Germany) where a rich landowner, Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf. Count Zinzendorf, a Lutheran, gave the Moravians farmland on his estate.

The members of the Moravian Church made it a custom to celebrate special occasions by sharing with friends a simple meal, a "Lovefeast." The name of the service is a literal translation of the New Testament word "agape." It is reminiscent of the "agape meal" shared by the early Christians as recorded in the New Testament- Acts 2.

The first Lovefeast was served in Germany on August 13th, 1727, following the Renewal of the Moravian Church. The first Lovefeast in the United States (the region now known as Winston-Salem) was held in Wachovia November 17, 1753, on the evening of the arrival of the first Moravian colonists in North Carolina. The traditional Moravian Lovefeast celebrates the birth of Christ through Scripture reading and prayer, the singing of hymns, the lighting of candles, and the serving of Moravian buns and coffee. Still today, Moravian Lovefeasts are celebrated several times a year, depending on the community and the Church. Moravians, after all these years, still use the same traditional recipe in preparing the buns.

Few churches today, still make their own buns... most churches buy their buns from Mrs. Pumpkins in Winston-Salem or buy from the Salem Bakery in Old Salem).

When we celebrate our Lovefeast or our service of Holy Communion, it's my prayer we come together as the early Moravians; spiritually prepared and united. I pray we come with a sense of anticipation and expectation that God will move in our midst and pour out His Spirit upon us. Much like He did for the Moravians at Herrnhut, who had gathered to pray, break bread and partake of Holy Communion in Berthelsdorf on August 13, 1727. May we, like the early Moravians, come together with eagerness; expecting God to move in our midst, as we surrender ourselves to the leading of our "Chief Elder" Jesus Christ and to God's Spirit.

I hope this significant portion of Moravian history was inspiring... I am also including some quotes from the Herrnhut diary concerning "We Learned to Love": August 13, 1727. The events of August 13, 1727 are for me, one of the most important day's in all of our Moravian Church history. There are other vital days to recall, but none with the same, lifechanging effects this day represents. When at the conclusion of a Holy Communion service in Berthelsdorf the residents of Herrnhut united into the *Renewed Brethren's Church*.

This special day in August is traditionally considered the "spiritual birthday" of the Moravian Church. Here, is an English translation, in its full description of those events as they were **recorded in the Herrnhut diary: "August 13, 1727":** "The profound and highly uplifting Communion was held on August 13. Beforehand, as we were on our way to church, everyone was talking with each other and here and there pairs were found among the brethren, willing to unite. The church service started with the **hymn: "Deliver Me, My God,"** whereby a wicked person, watching the ceremony, was totally overcome.

Afterwards Pastor Rothe, supported by the congregation, bestowed a true apostolic blessing upon the two confirmands. Then the congregation fell down before the Lord and started to cry and sing at the same time: "My Soul Before Thee Prostrate Lies." One could hardly tell whether we were singing or crying, but it happened with such grace that the officiating minister (because Pastor Rothe celebrated Communion among the congregation) was also totally perplexed by it.

After the hymn was finished some of the brethren prayed with divine power, laying before the Lord the plight of the congregation and especially that they were at a loss at what to do with those who had left us, doubting they would succeed without sectarianism or separatism, since both are not the right way for the Lord's house.

We also prayed childlike and modestly, that He should teach us the true nature of His church and how to live and walk in His law; that we remain unsullied and inoffensive, so we do not become solitary but fruitful, and neither violate the loyalty and obedience sworn to Him and His Word nor injure the common love through trivialities. We prayed that He would fully bestow on us the holy order of His grace, and not allow our souls to be led from the blood and-cross theology, on which our sole salvation depends. We laid before Him especially the worrying circumstances of our neighboring Brethren and of hundreds of souls that were awakened through our household, but now are partly led astray, partly fail to grow in the spirit and only want to burden themselves with knowledge.

Afterwards, as a great anointment flowed over us and we felt not far from Him, we prayed in faithful assurance that He should let our two Elders, Christian David and Melchior

Nitschmann (who were in Sorau with good intentions but with a tragic ending), be powerfully drawn into our fellowship and experience what we were experiencing.

Following the absolution, Communion was held with humbled and strengthened hearts, and each of us went home, feeling quite beside ourselves. On the way back to Herrnhut a wasp flew at the overseer [Zinzendorf] with rage and stung him hard on the hand just as he was in the process of trying to win over a separatist. We spent this day and the following in calm and joyful composure and learned to love...."

August 28... "Christian David and Melchior Nitschmann came back from Sorau and at once asked us what we had been doing on the morning of August 13. They had been in the orphanage at Sablatt and at 10 o'clock in the morning they received a strong urge to pray. They went up into the house's small tower with David Schneider, threw themselves down before the Savior, and were overcome with hundreds of tears and sweet thoughts of the congregation. They had never felt like that in their entire lives; they thought, what is happening in our congregation? If they could only know our circumstances!"

Financial Update for Second Quarter of 2021

Our monthly budget is \$10,372. The following reflects what our monthly giving and expenses for the second quarter of 2021:

June	\$13,186.00	\$11,972.00

For this quarter our total expenses exceeded income by about \$4,000. June's expenses were unusually high. This was due to the yearly copier lease payment of approximately \$2,500. Our contributions were high also during that same time because \$2,000 was transferred from Chicken Pie fund to cover cost of copier which the Board and Chicken Pie committee approved. New Hope also received about \$1,500 from the Southern Province. The Provincial Treasurer's office applied for this and was granted these funds from the Covid Relief Retention Credit on our behalf.

Your continued support is needed and appreciated for the remainder of the year. The Board and Stewardship Committee appreciates everyone's financial support of our church.
