God's Evaluation of Our Faithfulness!

This month, I'd like to talk with you about God's evaluation of our faithfulness. If you were to stand before God today, would you hear the words of (Matthew 25:21NIV): 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" In God's Church, we are all considered leaders in some capacity. Therefore, developing our ministry and leadership skills should be a priority.

In God's Church, we are called to know what's important in our life and what is not important in our life. A faithful follower of Christ knows how to wisely invest his or her time, talents, gifts and resources in the work of the Lord, the ministries of the Church. Christ calls His followers to bear fruit. A faithful follower of Christ makes his or her life count for the Kingdom of God. A faithful follower of Christ makes of the life and seeks to make substantial difference in the lives of others!

Proverbs 28:20 says, "A faithful man will be richly blessed, but one eager to get rich will not go unpunished." This verse contrasts faithfulness with a desire to get rich quick. We usually tend to think of being monetarily rich. But the author isn't talking about money. He's saying, realize, "there's more to life than the accumulation of money and stuff.

Scripture states: "do not worry." (Matthew 6:25-34 NIV) says....<sup>25</sup> "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than

food, and the body more than clothes? <sup>26</sup> Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? <sup>27</sup> Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? <sup>28</sup> "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. <sup>29</sup> Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. <sup>30</sup> If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? <sup>31</sup> So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' <sup>32</sup> For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. <sup>33</sup> But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. <sup>34</sup> Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

As followers of Christ, our faithfulness is confirmed and demonstrated by our refusal to put our faith in the riches and desires of this world, but in God! As followers of Christ, we work together and put our TRUST in Jesus and no other.

Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:5-6 (NRSV)

Our faithfulness is reflected in our relationship with Christ, rather than the materialistic world. Christ calls His faithful followers to invest their lives in other people. Faithful followers need to swim against the stream of the contemporary culture, which usually ask: "What's in it for me? What are my needs, my desires, my ambitions, my goals, my hurts, my values, my profit; what benefits me?" Faithful followers of Christ, focus more on the needs of others, rather than being absorbed in their own personal needs!

How do you become a faithful follower of Christ? (Galatians 5:22-23) says, "... the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control...." When the fruit of the Spirit lives in us; we demonstrate "faithfulness" to God by accepting the challenges and responsibilities God places before us.... God calls each one of us to bear fruit for His Kingdom.

Are YOU bearing fruit for God's Kingdom? How's the year going? Today, I would say take time out of your busy schedules to re-evaluate your life and the work you are doing for God's Kingdom! Christ calls His faithful followers to invest their lives in ministering to other people. Remember, I said earlier, "Faithful followers swim against the stream of the contemporary culture. Faithful followers focus more on the needs of others."

Where are you today? Are you committed to being one of God's faithful followers? Are you prepared to give testimony of what God is doing in your life? If you stood before God today, would you hear the words of (Matthew 25:21NIV): "Well done, good and faithful servant!" I pray these words ring loudly in your presence; I pray God works His work of faithfulness in your life today and every day.

Brothers and Sisters let's be found faithful... Let's bear fruit and bring praise and glory to God and HIs Kingdom together!

To keep the congregation informed the Board of Elders will continue to give quarterly updates on our financial status. Over the last year and early 2022, the Covid-19 Virus continued to present many issues for each of us and our sweet little church.

Our monthly budget for 2022 is \$10,685 for general expenses. The following reflects what our monthly giving and exact expenses were for the second quarter of 2022:

May expenses were very high due to payment of copier lease. (\$2,666.00)

These donations will be tracked for tax filing purposes. Transaction fees do apply, just under 3% for credit card transactions and \$0.75 for direct debit transactions.

The MMFA also provides a means to donate securities/stocks. Your broker transfers the securities/stocks to MMFA and the MMFA executes the securities/stocks into cash. Securities/stocks executed in this way are not subject to capital gains tax.
