New Hope is very blessed to have such a committed group of followers of the Lord Jesus Christ that love and care for one another. So to invite others in our community to come to our Church, just makes good sense, it gives us the opportunity to share God's love with others in our community.

## So, what do you do? You just invite people...It's that simple!

#### The Facts

**67%** of Americans say a personal invitation from a family member or friend would be effective in getting them to come back to Church. People like to know that we care about them. The Church is not

a select group of people; we are all sinners saved by God's grace. We are the family of God and we need each other...more than we think.

**63%** said they would come if the invitation came from a friend or a neighbor.

79% said they came to Church because a friend or relative invited them.

#### The Mission

The population of the un-churched in the U.S. is almost **100 million**. Studies show that only **21%** of Christians invite someone to Church in a year and **only 2% of those invited are un-churched**.

In Celebration of National Back-To-Church Sunday on September 17, we will have a Pizza luncheon. When you invite people to come to New Hope for the Back-To-Church Sunday, be sure to issue a special invitation for them to attend the luncheon that will be served in the Fellowship Hall immediately following worship. 

# MORAVIAN DISASTER RESPONSE

# **Hurricane Harvey and Extreme Flooding in Texas**

#### Please share this information broadly and with individuals in congregations:

Hurricane Harvey hit the Gulf Coast of the United States on Aug. 25, 2017 as a Catergory 4 storm with sustained winds of 130 mph. It has and continues to threaten millions of people with multiple days of heavy rain, winds and rising tides. This slow moving storm could bring up to 50 inches of rain to Texas in the days ahead.

While many have evacuated, significant damage is still expected, and thousands of people may be housed in shelters for an extended period of time.

The Board of World Mission has been following the response of our ecumenical partners, and have been in direct contact with representatives of the Unity of the Brethren Church in Texas, which has several congregations in the Houston area. Moravians have a shared heritage with this denomination going all the way back to Jan Hus, and they have a representative who attends BWM meetings.

The efforts of Moravian Disaster Response (MDR) will be in coordination with the Unity of the Brethren. They have asked for time to assess immediate and long term needs. If you are feeling called to help respond, please see avenues for donating and volunteering below. It is our hope to have donations ready to go and sent quickly once a plan of action has been put into place.




The first Handbell Choir rehearsal will be Wednesday, September 6th at 6:30 PM

Our theme for this upcoming Synod is "Living the Essentials with Courage for the Future." With this theme in mind, our Nominations Committee is seeking individuals who are willing to offer their leadership by giving of their time and talent in service on a variety of provincial boards.

At this Synod, delegates will elect individuals to serve 4-year terms on our provincial boards. The Nominations Committeeis currently seeking applications for the following:

To recommend someone as a candidate for nomination a Provincial Board Candidate Recommendation Form.

To **apply** as a candidate for nomination to any of the Provincial Boards EXCEPT Provincial Elders' Conference, use a **Provincial Board Candidate Information Form**.

Those interested in service on the Provincial Elders' Conference should complete the **PEC Candidate Information Form**.

There are **two options** for making recommendations or applying.

☐ Through a printed form to be downloaded, completed and delivered either via email or regular mail.

#### **Nominations Process**

An election \ manual, \ which includes \ sample \ ballots, \ will be forwarded to \ all \ Synod \ delegates \ for \ review \ in early 2018. The \ Committee \ will \ notify \ candidates \ about \ whether \ or \ not they \ are \ selected \ for \ formal \ nomination.$
